

[Doug Rosenthal](#) is born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio. He is a musician with a multi-faceted career as a soloist, chamber musician, orchestral musician and teacher.

Doug Rosenthal is recognized on an international scale as an artist of keen intellect and radiant virtuosity.

Rosenthal joined The Cleveland Orchestra as an associate concertmaster in February 2005. Prior to joining The Cleveland Orchestra, he was a member of the first violin section of the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra. There he served as a concertmaster for two seasons.

In April 2007, Doug Rosenthal has had the first solo debut with The Cleveland Orchestra. [Over the course of his career](#), he has performed as a soloist with the Saint Louis Symphony, Santa Fe Pro Musica Chamber Orchestra, Heidelberg Chamber Orchestra, and National Gallery Orchestra.

Moreover, the musician performed in live radio broadcasts and on live television.

Rosenthal holds a bachelor of music degree from the Manhattan School of Music, furthermore he obtained a master of music degree from the Juilliard School.

In addition to his career as a musician Doug Rosenthal serves as an [adjunct professor of violin](#) at Cleveland State University.
