- ODI and UNICEF | Report | Feb 2023 | <u>Strengthening</u> inclusive social protection systems for displaced children and their families This report sheds light on the following questions: How do inclusive social protection systems support displaced children and their families? What are the benefits of inclusive social protection for displaced populations, host communities, local economies and state institutions? What are some of the common barriers but also opportunities for realising better child outcomes through social protection that includes displaced children?
- Global Social Policy | Journal Article | Feb 2023 | <u>Beyond rights-based social protection for refugees</u> This article seeks to address the paucity of literature on how refugees strategize around access to social assistance beyond Northern-mandated approaches. The authors review existing research on Syrian displacement in Lebanon to interrogate assumptions that refugees automatically seek institutionalised assistance.

- World Bank | Working Paper | Jan 2023 | <u>Do Cash Transfer Programs Protect from Poverty in the Case of Aggregate Shocks?</u>: A Study on Typhoon Yolanda in the <u>Philippines</u> This paper assesses the performance of the Philippines' Conditional Cash Transfer Programme in the aftermath of typhoon Yolanda in 2013. Using triple difference techniques, it finds that the programme effectively protected households affected by the storm from falling into extreme poverty.
 - Climate Risk Management | Journal Article | Dec 2022 | Migration and climate change The role of social protection This systematic literature review of 28 studies identifies evidence for how social protection has influenced beneficiaries' migration decisions, experiences, and outcomes in the context of a changing climate, through cash transfers, public work programs, insurance, and health care.
- Sahel Adaptive Social Protection Program | Report | Dec 2022 | Linking Humanitarian Cash Assistance and National Social Protection Systems This study looks at the current (2020-2022) alignment and links between social protection programmes on the one hand and humanitarian assistance provided by donors and agencies on the other in six countries in the Sahel region: Burkina Faso, Chad, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, and Senegal.
- ODI | Toolkit | Dec 2022 | Linking social protection and humanitarian assistance: Guidance to assess the factors and actors that determine an optimal approach in a displacement setting This toolkit offers guidance to actors providing assistance to displaced populations, to help them consider whether and how NGO/internationally-led humanitarian assistance might be linked with state-led social protection (for more research outputs of the same project see also here).
- FAO | Brief | Mar 2021 | Social Protection and Climate Change This brief stresses the important role social protection plays in supporting inclusive climate risk-management strategies that contribute to safeguarding livelihoods and increasing the resilience of households.
