- CALP | Report | Apr 2023 | <u>In Progress: A Review of Forms of Coordination Between Cash Working Groups and Social Protection Systems in the Americas</u> provides a mapping of the initiatives and scope of coordination efforts aimed at linking humanitarian CVA with social protection in each country in the Americas that has a CWG or maintains similar coordination spaces.
- ESCWA | Report | Mar 2023 | Supporting the humanitarian-development-peace nexus in conflict and fragile settings discusses the opportunities offered and challenges faced when putting the principles of the humanitarian-development-peace nexus, inlcuding in social protection, into practice in fragile and conflict affected Arab countries and outlines a roadmap for building the institutional capacities of governments.
- World Bank | Report | Mar 2023 | Responsive by Design:

 Building Adaptive Social Protection Systems in South Asia

 details the international best practices on developing adaptive social protection systems and discusses how these can be applied to South Asia using the new stress-test methodology.
- Climate Risk Management | Journal Article | Mar 2023 | Can social protection tackle emerging risks from climate change, and how? A framework and a critical review discusses the potential of social protection as a policy response to climate change. It explores the implications of climate change risks for social protection and reviews what social protection could do and what it currently does to manage risks arising from climate change.
- GIZ | Working Paper | Mar 2023 | Joint reviews for <u>Adaptive Social Protection Systems</u> intends to orient social protection practitioners on how to approach, structure and facilitate a joint review that involves different sector ministries in order to strengthen a social protection system's shock-responsiveness and adaptiveness.
- UNICEF | Report | March 2023 | Responses to disasters and crises through subnational social protection systems presents key findings, lessons, and recommendations on how governments in Europe and Central Asia have responded to disasters and crises through subnational social protection systems, covering case studies from: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Tajikistan and Ukraine.

- World Bank | Report | Mar 2023 | Technical Analysis to Inform the Trigger Design for Adaptive Safety Nets in Malawi 2023 summarizes the technical work that was conducted to build the government's capacity to design a trigger mechanism to scale up the Governemnts flagship cash transfer programme to additional beneficiaries in the event of climate shocks, specifically droughts.
- IDB | Report | Feb 2023 | Shock-responsive social protection and climate shocks in Latin America and the Caribbean: Lessons from COVID-19 investigates how non-contributory social protection (mainly income support) has been used to respond to previous climate-related shocks and to COVID-19, and what are the implications for managing climate-related shocks in the future.
- IDS | BASIC Research Working Paper | Dec 2022 | Financing in Fragile and Conflict Contexts: Evidence, Opportunities, and Barriers provides a summary of the main trends and issues regarding both regular and risk financing in FCAS. It considers the main lessons observed in financing social assistance in FCAS and identifies useful examples emerging from countries developing risk-informed programmes for the most vulnerable.
- IDS | BASIC Research Working Paper | Oct 2022 | What is Known About Capacity and Coordination of Social Assistance Programmes in Crisis Situations? reviews the literature and documented evidence on capacity and coordination issues in crisis situations, where social protection and humanitarian assistance intersect, finding that although both terms are mentioned frequently, they are rarely defined or robustly and systematically assessed.
- UNFPA, CWG, NORCAP, GBV Sub-Cluster Iraq | Report | Sep 2022 | Transitioning out of Humanitarian Cash Assistance in Iraq: Critical Actions to Ensure Gender-based Violence Risks are Mitigated and Prevented throughout the Transition | presents the recommendations that were formulated as a result of a workshop in June, highlighting critical actions to work toward mitigating GBV risks during the transition to greater Government assistance in place of current humanitarian Cash assistance.
